



"How God Set Me Free From Addiction" An Interview with Bishop Robert Lee Mitchell, Jr.



What was your addiction?

1. I was addicted to powder and crack cocaine, weed and alcohol for more than 10 years. My addiction just seemed to get greater and greater with each usage.

2. When did you know that you were facing an enemy that you could not defeat alone?

I realized I was fighting an enemy when I couldn't keep money in my pocket. I kept losing jobs and relationships. I couldn't pass the drug test and I kept drinking and using even though I was working. I also kept praying but I was praying the wrong prayer. I knew I couldn't fight this battle alone.

3. Recovery is a road typically filled with hurdles, potholes and unexpected twists and turns. What were some of the challenges that you faced?

Drug and alcohol usage was my biggest hurdle. I wasn't as close to God as I thought I was. I went to several programs, some 28 days, some 90 days. I called on Jesus. But a lot of people knew I was an addict. Someone even told me, "you got a smell on you". The smell from the weed was all in my clothes and all in my body, just lingering. I couldn't get rid of it. I wasn't fooling anybody. I couldn't run and I couldn't hide. The smell was coming out of my pores.

4. Oftentimes, people who struggle with addictions blame others (family, friends, etc.) for their predicament. They even blame God. Did you have similar feelings?

Yes, I hurt both my parents, my mom, bless her heart and my dad. My mom is deceased now but I remember cursing both of them out. I feel bad about that but that is what I did when I was dealing with my addiction. I hurt other people as well. I would leave church and go out to drink or go to the club. I didn't care. People I knew saw me but I didn't care what they said about me. I also didn't think that God cared about me. One time I even overdosed on pills because my craving was so bad. I prayed that God would relieve me of my suffering and let me die. I almost succeeded but I didn't. God didn't let me die. God healed me and cleaned my house, cleaned my temple.

5. During your recovery, what was the most important thing that you learned about yourself?

I learned that I had to get real with God. I had to get closer to God. I learned that I needed God to heal me. I couldn't do it by myself.

6. Finally, what is the most important thing that you learned about God during this process?

I learned that God was always there. God carried me when I couldn't carry myself. God comforted me when I needed it. God gave me and my father a better relationship. God let me see who God really is and who His Son really is. I am very thankful for that and hope to use my testimony to help others.



"Living With Hydrocephalus: How God has kept Me"-Laci Robinson



On Saturday July 29, 2017, my mother and I traveled to Nicklaus Children's Hospital in Miami, Florida to attend a conference focused on Hydrocephalus. While I was there I met neurosurgeons, neuropsychologists, teachers, advocates and educators. I also met families and individuals who were living with hydrocephalus. During the conference I learned that there are several ongoing research and clinical trials dedicated to finding a cure for hydrocephalus. Hydrocephalus is a neurological disorder that affects the brain. Hydrocephalus basically means "water on the brain" and this extra fluid can cause damage to the brain.

It is estimated that over 1 million people are living with hydrocephalus and the only treatment is brain surgery. Typically, a small valve called a shunt is inserted into the brain to drain the excess fluid. Some people acquire hydrocephalus at birth, others get it later in life from accidents, cancer, etc. Some have actually died from having hydrocephalus. Doctors still don't understand why hydrocephalus happens and unfortunately, there is still no cure. So everyone should know that anyone with a brain can end up with hydrocephalus at anytime.

Hydrocephalus affects individuals in different ways. For example, individuals with hydrocephalus may have trouble with motor skills, memory, organization, processing information, managing emotions and cognitive skills. This impacts home, school, and work life. It can also make social life very awkward because unlike autism, attention deficit disorder, or cancer, the average person probably hasn't heard of hydrocephalus. This sometimes makes me and others with this condition feel misunderstood and personally, I find it hard to explain to others about my hydrocephalus condition. Maybe this is why I was so inspired after meeting young people and family members of those living with hydrocephalus. I really appreciated them sharing their experiences of overcoming challenges and dealing with some setbacks, such as multiple surgeries. I personally feel blessed because I have only had my initial surgery when the shunt was placed in my brain at 3 days old and one revision when I was 14 years old to replace the shunt after it disconnected. I was sad to hear stories such as a young person having more than 40 surgeries to fix the shunt in her brain. I was also sad to hear of those who died.

However, as a result of attending this conference, I plan to participate in the "Hydrocephalus Walk" that will take place in Deerfield Park, FL, in October. The purpose of this walk is to raise money that can be used to help fund research. I also plan to become an advocate for others dealing with hydrocephalus by volunteering to speak to my congressional representative on Capitol Hill in Washington D.C. to help increase awareness about hydrocephalus. Furthermore, I plan to participate in other local and national awareness campaigns and activities sponsored by the Hydrocephalus Association (hydroc.org).

Overall, I know that God has blessed me for 31 years with a loving family and has allowed me to travel the world and go to college and get good grades. Yet, it hasn't always been easy going to see so many doctors, missing school, having cat scans, MRIs (Magnetic Resonance Imaging), and always feeling different from my peers. But I feel the least I can do is inspire others who may be dealing with hydrocephalus or any other health condition, to live a happy and fulfilled life and experience the joy Jesus has for them.



Alzheimer's and my Dad: A Spiritual Reflection through One Daughter's Eyes By Rev. Dr. Lisa Robinson

"Hunker Down and Prepare for the Storm. Get out of Matthews way!" The voice from the Charleston, SC radio station boomed with conviction, just as the ruthless winds from Hurricane Matthew ricocheted from Florida and barreled towards the Georgia and South Carolina coasts. Yet, this was not the only storm brewing near our family household that week of October 7, 2016. Like Matthew, this second storm had a name too. Its name was Alzheimer's. While the speed and force of the rain swelled outside, tears began to swell inside of me until the severity of the sadness forced them outside. Torn between the reality of Storm Matthew and the reality of my father's new diagnosis of early stage Alzheimer's, I knew I could not lean on my own understanding; I had to lean on God.

Weather radar reports said Matthew would be the biggest storm in a decade, the mother of all storms. Yet, this Alzheimer's diagnosis was my mother of all storms because I am a daddy's girl. During these new brewing storms, there were fleeting moments of silence interspersed with flickering moments of anxious tension. From Matthew to Alzheimer's, from Alzheimer's to Matthew, my mind was spinning trying to wrap my brain around a double trauma.

In the media, one official even cautioned that this was clearly the time to pray. He further warned that those who didn't prepare with proper shelter, food, water, gas and other necessities before Hurricane Matthew hit might be left to fend for themselves. With the diagnosis of Alzheimer's also hovering, it was definitely time to pray. However, I believed that the God I serve would not leave my family and I to fend for ourselves.

Painfully, the reality is that when Matthew began to subside, Alzheimer's would remain with my family. But, God had to know that dad was enjoying his retirement years with my mother. God had to know that they would soon be celebrating 58 years of marriage. God had to know that my dad wanted to be around to see his grandchildren fulfill their dreams. And, God had to know that if I remarried, I wanted my dad to walk me down the

aisle. I realize that these were selfish motives but I uttered them anyway. I told God, "You had to know..."

On one hand, I wished that the doctors would call and regretfully say that they made a mistake; that it was a misdiagnosis. On the other hand, I knew that the diagnosis was accurate and would not be amended. All that we could do is help bear our father's burdens and love him through all the phases of loss that accompany Alzheimer's. We would all suffer together, listen closer, cry together, and pray together. Alzheimer's is such a devastating disease, but as a Christian family, we have battled it together, with God's help.

It is excruciatingly painful to watch a parent whom you love in ways so multilayered, and which you have never enumerated them aloud, begin to lose his or her cognizance and memory of you. So, while the medical community continues to search for a cure, my family and I will continue to turn to each other and to the Bible to glean ways to survive this mother of all storms.

To every family who has received this devastating diagnosis, and for those who will in days to come, whether you believe in God or not, I believe God cares about your suffering and that of your loved-one. My hope is that your family (biological and otherwise) will huddle around your loved-one and take in every moment—good, bad, and ugly—and grab and hold on for dear life to every memory that you can. Hold on to every smile, every tear, every conversation, and every glance; do not let Alzheimer's steal everything.

Importantly, I urge you, please do not attempt to go it alone. This disease has tentacles; it will reach into every area of a families' life and wreak havoc. So, reach out to others; your pastor, your church, your support system, they can help. Groups such as the Alzheimer's Association (alz.org) and the Alzheimer's Foundation of America (alzfdn.org) are also good resources. This message is especially intended for families and persons of color who too often try to confront and suffer through medical burdens alone.

Finally, as you endure, what at times will seem like the mother of all storms, from a daughter holding on tightly to her dad, please know that I will be praying for you.






